Disease burden is stable or in decline for a period of fourteen days

Healthcare system maintains surge capacity to treat COVID-19 individuals

A satisfactory inventory level of PPE for medical professionals, first responders and vulnerable populations with coordinated distribution

04

Community testing remains accessible, maintaining supplies sufficient for demand based on current guidance

05

Coordinated education for responsible implementation of guidance for individuals and businesses

Use of Masks or PPE: staff, volunteers and customers

Retrofitting Spaces For Reopening:

Physical distancing for staff & customers

Personal care & fitness remain closed

Occupancy: 10 or less - Allow for 6' distancing

Staggered timing of schedules

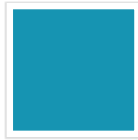
Golf, boating & fishing with distance

Continue if able

RECOVERY | Phase Three Highlights



Occupancy Increase

Moderate for Indoor and Outdoor

Distance & Safety

No common touch items, use disposable where possible



Indoor Spaces

Occupancy: 25% based on fire code - Allow for 6' distancing

Hosts keep an accurate list of those in attendance



Outdoor Spaces

State parks open

Scaled Occupancy – Allowing for 6' distancing

Concessions open with spacing

Posted restrictions

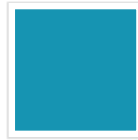


Work From Home

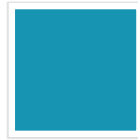
All outdoor recreation allowed

All businesses, schools and places of recreation can open with new safety guidance & procedures



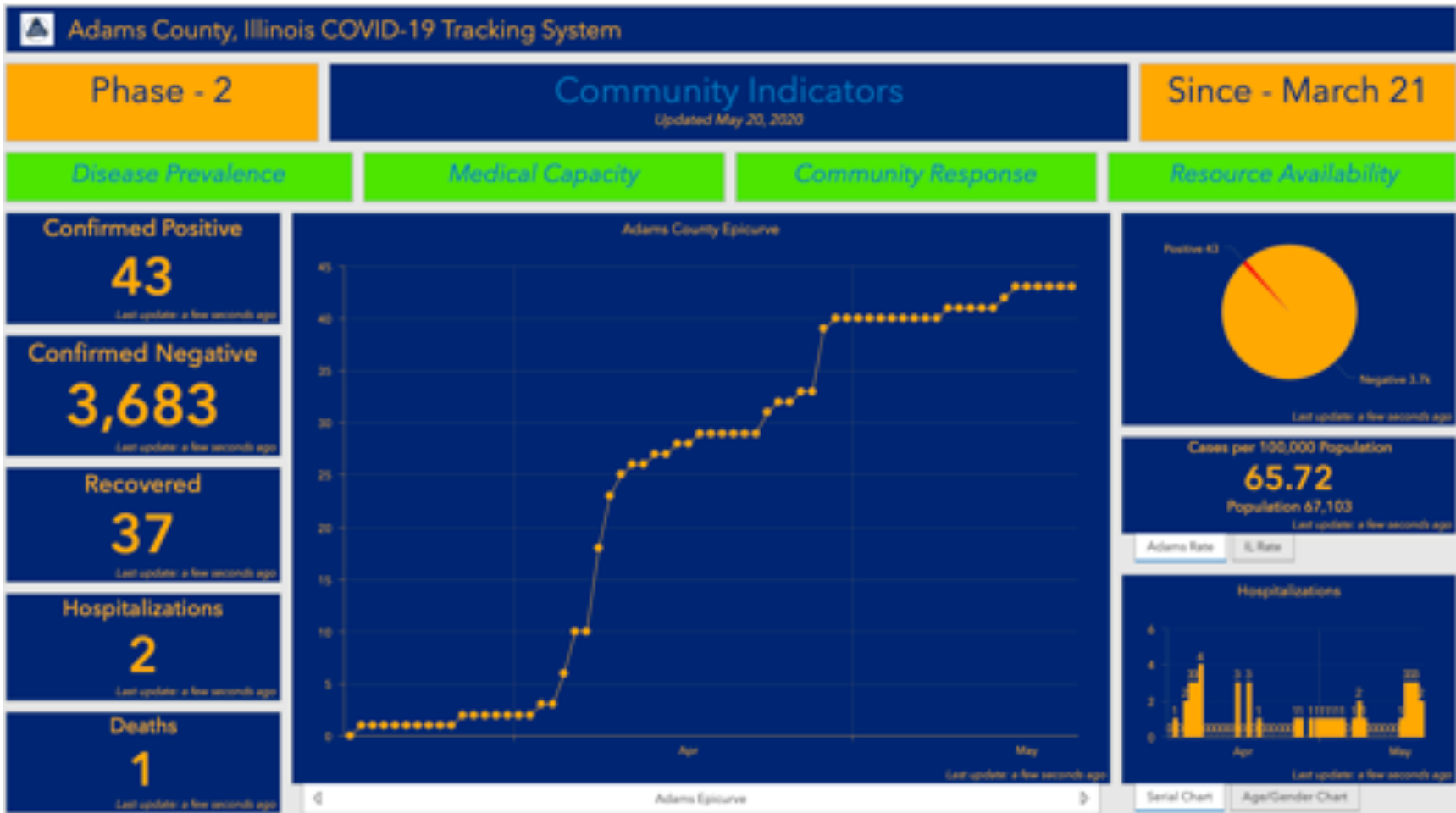
Large Gatherings

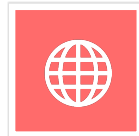
